- Be able to generalize, explain and draw conclusions in every subject/discipline



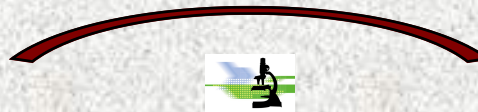

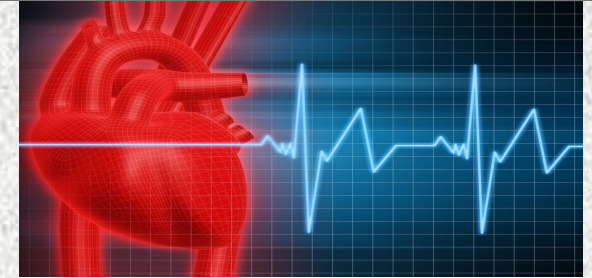

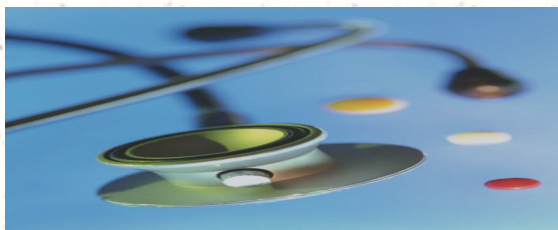
