SCHOOL UNIFORM

Trombly students are required to wear a uniform everyday. The uniform policy is enforced according to the Detroit Public Schools Student Code of Conduct.

TOPS

Long or short sleeved solid white, navy blue or black blouse, shirt or polo shirt with a well-defined collar or a turtleneck tucked in at the waistline.

The same colors apply for sweaters, both cardigan and pullover styles, and jackets. No hoods for high school students. Logos and trademarks must be less than an inch in diameter. Detroit Public Schools logos of any size may be worn.

SLACKS, SKIRTS

Navy blue or Black fastened at the waist and worn with a belt. Jeans (denim) and stretch materials for slacks and skirts are not acceptable.

Must be closed heel and closed toe, laced or loafer style. Mules are acceptable.
